


Directions The event centre will be at the [Barley Mow](#), post code RG23 7JZ & GR [SU573502](#). Free Parking will be found just north outside the nearby Junior School gates/local shops as space now is very limited within the actual Pub car park.

Map/Areas: 1:4,000 on A4 waterproof paper, 5m contours; new map specifically drawn for this event. Oakley is a gently undulating suburban area. All areas marked 'Settlement' are definitely OOB!

Courses: 1 hour score event around Oakley, using an Odds/Evens method as per guidelines. There will be a yellow/orange course suitable for juniors; torches will be essential. N.B. All juniors under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

Punching start, just turn up, register & go!
EMIT eCards will be used on all courses. Everyone must report to Download afterwards!

Times: Registration: - 18:00 to 18:45 – this will take place in the pub.
Starts: - 18:15 to 19:00
Courses close: - promptly at 20:00 please. We don't wish to organise a search....

Lost Cards will be charged at £45.

Facilities: Toilets in pub, First Aid, usual pub drinks at the bar (optional!); food to order being made available just for us; those wishing to eat after a run should ideally check the menu and make choices before setting off on their run. Food will then be served shortly after 20.00, subject to demand.

Safety: All competitors **must** wear hi-viz tops & have **sufficient** lights to complete their course (take a back up!). No road crossings will be manned so please take care. Course/Points/safety details will be available on the night.
